BANCROFT LANE TREE WORK TO BEGIN! You should have received a letter recently from Mayor Magers regarding the need to replace some of the damaged Ash trees on Bancroft Lane. Please use caution when traveling on the Lane and look for the improvements to the tree canopy to begin soon.

SAFETY TIPS

LET'S ALL BE GOOD NEIGHBORS!

Please do not leave your garbage cans out or visible from the street. Bancroft Code of Ordinances "§50.16 requires that trash bins be removed from the street by the end of the day on collection day.

As a courtesy to your neighbors and for the safety of children and other residents, please remember not to leave cars parked on street for extended periods of time or across from the entrance of someone's driveway. City of Bancroft, Code of Ordinances, "§72.06 prohibits vehicles from being parked on the street for more than 24 hours.

We have received complaints regarding dogs running loose in the city. This is not only a violation of Bancroft City Ordinances but also Louisville Metro Ordinances. Please remember dogs must be on leashes at all times. We have also received many complaints about dogs being left out all day barking as well. Dogs allowed to bark for long periods of time are considered a nuisance as well.

Please also clean up after your pets.
