HOW CAN WE CONTACT THE POLICE?

- 2. Non-Emergency-Dial 311 3. NEW: Talk to Chief Yeager via the Bancroft Police Car Phone. For nondispatch communication, you can call 502-263-3663 and leave a voicemail message with your name and phone number and Chief Yeager will call you back when he is working. For your safety please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Yeager is working, then they will dispatch him to help you. If Chief Yeager is not working, then they will dispatch a Metro Police Officer to help you.

Attention Dog Owners...

Bancroft has a nuisance ordinance that prohibits frequent and persistent barking dogs in the city. Your dog may be deemed a nuisance if it is allowed to continuously bark.

Insurance Premium Tax Fees We are asking for your help to ensure that your insurance company is aware that you reside in the *City of* **Bancroft**, not the City of Louisville. This allows Bancroft to receive the tax fee instead of Louisville.

CAN YOU HELP?

- Turn on your porch lights and exterior lights at night.
- Keep your doors locked, even in the • davtime.
- Lock your car doors and remove valuables from your cars, even if locked.
- Keep your garage door closed, • especially at night.
- If you see something suspicious, • then say something.
- Call 911 if you see a prowler. •
- Call Chief Yeager if you would like more information on effective crime prevention techniques.
