February Notes from the Mayor

As you all know, Bancroft has switched our trash service back to Rumpke effective on Feb. 3, 2020. The contract with Anytime Waste Systems was terminated by mutual agreement between the City Commission and Anytime Waste Systems management. There is no need to review the details of the past seven months regarding the services provided by Anytime. I appreciate your patience while we worked with Anytime to resolve the issues brought to us by Bancroft residents. The City Commission had an obligation to attempt to resolve the service issues under the contract that was awarded to Anytime through a competitive bidding process. Thanks to Commissioner Paul Chumbley and Rumpke service representative Chris Pierce for their work toward making the transition back to Rumpke as smooth as possible. Rumpke sent a letter to all residents providing information about trash, recycling, and yard waste. The letter also included recycling and holiday schedules for the remainder of 2020.

Important Dates and Information from Rumpke

At the February City Commission meeting, we will discuss the planning process for the repaving of Bancroft streets. In the near future, we will announce a public hearing on the repaving project. The public hearing is a requirement under state law before any municipal road funds can be used for the repaving project. Residents will be able to learn more about the details of the project and comment on the plans. The City Commission is working closely with our City

Engineer, Chuck Wood, throughout this process. We are grateful for Chuck's expertise and his willingness to devote his time to this project.

For immediate police assistance:

1. Emergency: Dial 911

2. Non-emergency police assistance: Dial 311

For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:

 Call our police line at (502) 263-3663. Leave a voicemail with your name and phone number.
 Chief Yeager will call you back when he is on-duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Yeager is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Yeager to get assistance for an emergency.

CRIME PREVENTION

Chief Yeager works hard to keep Bancroft safe. Here are a few of his simple crime prevention tips.

- Turn on your porch lights and exterior lights at night.
- Keep your doors locked, even in the daytime.
- Lock your car doors and remove valuables from your cars, even if locked.
- Keep your garage door closed, especially at night.
- If you see something suspicious, then say something.
- Call 911 if you see a prowler.
