March City Alerts

Bancroft Resurfacing Project

The Commission has started the process to repave our streets. Several commissioners along with our City Engineer and Bancroft resident Chuck Wood conducted a field survey of all our city streets. The purpose of this effort was to verify all locations where curb and gutter replacement was needed in conjunction with the upcoming city-wide street resurfacing project. We are primarily looking for locations where the existing concrete curb and gutter has settled, forming a low area that extends out in the asphalt pavement and allows ponding when it rains. This condition needs to be corrected because the standing water will speed the deterioration of the asphalt pavement. It will also create a safety hazard to the driving public when temperatures fall below freezing and ice can form. Several other sections of curb and gutter that were badly cracked or deteriorated were also noted and will be included for replacement. The majority of existing curbs and gutters, while old and showing some wear, are still intact and functioning properly to get rainwater off of the streets and into the underground drainage system. Please stay tuned to upcoming newsletters and the Bancroft Facebook page for updates on our resurfacing project. We also welcome you to attend the commission meetings to learn more. We will be happy to address any of your concerns or questions.

The City Commission, along with City Engineer Chuck Wood (a Bancroft resident), have worked diligently preparing for the repaving of city streets. Part of that process involves repairing damaged curb and gutters. Please contact Commissioner Mike Borders if you know of any specific areas where there are curb and gutter damages. Commissioner Borders, Commissioner Evers, and Chuck Wood have made a preliminary assessment of damaged areas, but they welcome any input from residents.

On Sunday, March 8th we switch to daylight savings time. I encourage everyone to check and/or change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

CRIME PREVENTION

Chief Yeager works hard to keep Bancroft safe. Here are a few of his simple crime prevention tips.

- Turn on your porch lights and exterior lights at night.
- Keep your doors locked, even in the daytime.
- Lock your car doors and remove valuables from your cars, even if locked.

Chief Yeager will call you back when he is on-duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Yeager is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Yeager to get assistance for an emergency.

- Keep your garage door closed, especially at night.
- If you see something suspicious, then say something.
- Call 911 if you see a prowler.

- Emergency phone numbers
- Is anyone supposed to be there while you are away
- When you are leaving and when you plan to return
