City of Bancroft Road Paving Update

Milling work starts Monday, July 13. It will last for three days. Paving will begin Wednesday, July 15. The entire project should be wrapped up in five days, weather permitted. This work will be done in phases.

Milling on Tuesday, July 14 and Paving on Thursday, July 16

- Maria Ave from Greenlawn Road to Goose Creek
- Greenlawn Drive from Hollen Road to Maria Ave
- Glenn Arbor Road
- Adler Way
- Hollen Road

Milling on Wednesday, July 15 and Paving on Friday, July 17

- Maria Court from Greenlawn to just before Hayward Road
- Bancroft Lane
- · Greenlawn from Maria to the end of Bancroft city limits

Bancroft Road Paving Update

Again, this schedule is 100% weather dependent. If there are any changes, we will let you know as soon as we have them. We will be posting on Facebook as well as sending out Reach Alerts. If you have not signed up for Reach Alerts, you can <u>find</u> <u>out more here.</u> Create an account and search Bancroft when asked which network to join.

A portion of upper Maria and the majority of Keisler Way will not be paved. They were included in paving by the city of Louisville within the last couple of years and after evaluating the state of the roads and considering our priority to be fiscally responsible for this project, we determined they do not need to be repaved, thus saving the city some money on this project. However, there is a patch of Keisler Way that is in need of repair and we will take care of that as part of this project.

Hall Contracting, who is conducting this work, has indicated they will put out signs in the areas where work is scheduled. They are in charge of traffic control, though Chief Yeager will also be out assisting.

We do not expect any obstruction to your driveway. However, if you plan on leaving your home on the day your road is scheduled to be paved, it is important you do not drive on the road when they are working in that area. When the crew puts down the tack coat prior to the asphalt, it will stick to your tires and then be transferred to your driveway. There will be no way to remove it. If this is a concern, please consider parking your car on a street that will not be paved on that day. There will be no citations for cars parked on the street overnight.

You likely have noticed crews completed curb and gutter work at the end of this week. We repaired 22 spots in the city we hope will help with drainage.

We appreciate your patience with this project. We have been planning and saving for this for several years. We want to ensure we do not want the roads to deteriorate to the point that would be hazardous to those driving and walking through the neighborhood. Based on the professional opinions of those who have looked at our street, we determined now is the best time. This has also worked out to our favor because of the unusually low cost of oil we expect to come in several thousand dollars under budget.
