December Notes from the Mayor

The November election saw our four incumbent city commissioners re-elected to two-year terms. Congratulations to Commissioners Jaimie Schapker, Paul Chumbley, Mike Borders, and Ed Evers on their reelection. Your commissioners spend many hours working to serve the City of Bancroft and they do it for a mere \$25 per month. Notice I did not call this pay since the amount is too small to refer to it as pay. These positions are essentially volunteer positions. They do not serve in these positions for money. Their willingness to take on the tasks of serving as a city commissioner epitomizes selfless service for the good of our city. I want to personally thank our commissioners for seeking another term of service and for their time and dedication. I look forward to working with them as I finish the last two years of my current term as mayor.

You may note that the city commission meeting agenda has included a proposal for a new police pursuit policy. I need to explain the need to approve a new policy. Earlier this year the Kentucky legislature passed HB 298 that compels Kentucky police departments to develop police pursuit policies that include various required standards and new elements. Every police department in the commonwealth must submit their new pursuit policy to the Department of Criminal Justice Training (DOCJT) for approval. DOCJT was the state agency designated for this task. The Kentucky League of Cities (KLC) has a model policy that meets the requirements of HB 298. We are working on using the KLC model policy as a basic format for our new pursuit policy. These new requirements are intended to do everything possible to provide strict standards for police pursuits to ensure the safety of everyone, including the public, police officers, and the suspects being pursued.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe and happy holiday season.
