May Notes from the Mayor

On Memorial Day, our nation will honor Americans who were killed while serving their country in the military. This Memorial Day will have special significance for my family. On December 7, 1941, Seaman Second Class Howard "Scott" Magers, U.S. Navy, from Merry Oaks, KY (Barren County) was serving on the U.S.S. Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. During the attack, the Oklahoma was sunk and 429 sailors were killed. When their bodies were recovered many were never identified.

My cousin, Scott Magers, was one of those unidentified sailors from the U.S.S. Oklahoma buried in Honolulu, Hawaii. In 2015, the bodies were exhumed and the Navy began the process of identifying the bodies using modern forensic science techniques. In April 2021, the U.S. Navy contacted Scott's surviving family in Merry Oaks to tell them they had identified his remains.

Honoring the family's wishes, the U.S. Navy will bury Scott in Merry Oaks, KY with full military honors. Obviously, I never knew my cousin, but my family was from Barren County where my father lived until just before the U.S. entered World War II. My father and aunt, both deceased, knew Scott well. My family in Louisville will be traveling to Barren County on Saturday, May 29 to participate in the burial services to honor a young man who left the life he knew in Merry Oaks and voluntarily joined the U.S. Navy as the war in Europe was threatening to truly become a World War.

This Memorial Day, let us remember that the service members who died in wars serving their country are more than names on a stone, or numbers tallied and reported in history books. Remember that they were sons, daughters, mothers, fathers, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, cousins, husbands, wives, and friends to people who mourned their loss. You too may have friends, relatives, acquittances, or close family members who were killed in one of the military services.

Let us take time during our leisure activities on Memorial Day weekend to remember and honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country.
