

Her husband Chuck said she wanted to be active in serving Bancroft as the city clerk as a way to give back to the community she loved so much. Being the city clerk, and then later the City Commissioner for Finance and Administration was a natural fit for Valerie since he had earned a degree in accounting at the University of Louisville.

Former Bancroft Mayor Kim Reinhart said about Valerie that "she wanted the neighborhood to be the best it could be." Kim said that Valerie was frequently the "voice of reason" when the city commission had to deal with difficult and controversial issues and she "had good ideas and truly put the city and residents first" in everything she did.

Chuck said that Valerie was outgoing and friendly with everyone. Chuck and Valerie had been married 51 years and had two children, Brian and Susan, and five grandchildren. Chuck said their family was very important to her, especially her grandchildren. Valerie was a grandmaster Bridge player, former real estate agent, and she worked at an accounting firm at one point in her life. Chuck and Valerie enjoyed boating with their family and friends in their houseboat on the Ohio River.

Valerie was an active member of Northeast Christian Church.

It is appropriate that we remember Valerie at this time as a person who lived life to its fullest with her family, friends, and Bancroft neighbors and found time to devote countless hours to the City of Bancroft.

HOW CAN WE CONTACT THE POLICE?

For immediate police assistance:

1. Emergency: Dial 911

2. Non-emergency police assistance: **Dial 311**

For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:

1. Call our police line at **(502) 263-3663.** Leave a voicemail with your name and phone number. Chief Mudd will call you back when he is on duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Mudd is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Mudd to get assistance for an emergency.
