POLICE NOTES FROM CHIEF MUDD

Best wishes for a Happy New Year to all Bancroft residents and their families! I would like to take this opportunity to comment on a couple of items that have come to my attention over the last few weeks.

First, as often during this time of year, the days are often cloudy or there is inclement weather with which to contend. To keep our streets safe for pedestrian and vehicular traffic alike, please remember to turn on your vehicles lights when dealing with low visibility. KRS 189.030 requires headlamps to be illuminated 1/2 hour after sunset and 1/2 hour before sunrise and at other times when atmospheric conditions render visibility as low or lower than usual during that period. Keep in mind that simply placing your lights on "Auto" may not illuminate them during the day when there is inclement weather.

Second, if severe weather including snow accumulation is indicated, please try to park your vehicles in your driveway if possible. This allows the streets to be better cleared afterwards, as well as making them safer to traverse for residents and emergency vehicles. This is especially true in curves or near intersections. If in doubt as to whether this is necessary, please feel free to reach out to me or check the city's Facebook page as there is often information about this posted there.

Thanks to everyone for their well wishes during the holiday season and for making Bancroft such a pleasure to serve!

HOW CAN WE CONTACT THE POLICE?

For immediate police assistance:

- 1. Emergency: Dial 911
- 2. Non-emergency police assistance: Dial 311

For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:

1. Call our police line at **(502) 263-3663.** Leave a voicemail with your name and phone number. Chief Mudd will call you back when he is on duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Mudd is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Mudd to get assistance for an emergency.
