MAYOR'S NOTES

Can you believe that 5 months of this year have come and gone? As the City's fiscal year comes to an end, your commission is preparing a budget for the new year beginning July 1. At our May meeting, we had the first reading of both the "tax rate ordinance" and the "budget ordinance". Once again this year we will likely be lowering the tax rate you pay for Bancroft's share of your total tax bill. While we have no

commissioners, and mayor, each have an area of responsibility for city management. When I first came on the commission I was asked to oversee the finance and administration portion of the city. Working with our city treasurer along with my fellow commissioners I feel very proud to have been that successful with our tax rate. Early in 2022 the commission approved my motion to join the Kentucky League of Cities investment pool. While I don't have the exact numbers I can tell you that we invested roughly \$400,000 of former CD money into the fund. As of the 15th of May, if we were to withdraw it all, we would have approximately a 25% gain or \$500,000 total. That is one of the tremendous values Bancroft has as a member of KLC.

Looking forward, one of the topics the commission will be looking in to is the modernization of our street lights. New, LED lighting could be much brighter and less costly. Along with improvement we will be determining if any more lighting might be beneficial. We will be having an activity surrounding July 4 th , and as the year goes we will have others. It is a great time to enjoy your neighborhood and your neighbors. As home sales continue, yes even in Bancroft, welcome your new neighbors when they move in. You never know what you might have in common. We have a nice young family as new neighbors. He and I have already discovered our mutual love for aircraft. Read the newsletter to stay informed. For immediate police assistance:

2. Non-emergency police assistance: **Dial 311**

For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:

1. Call our police line at **(502) 263-3663**. Leave a voicemail with your name and phone number. Chief Mudd will call you back when he is on duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Mudd is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Mudd to get assistance for an emergency.
