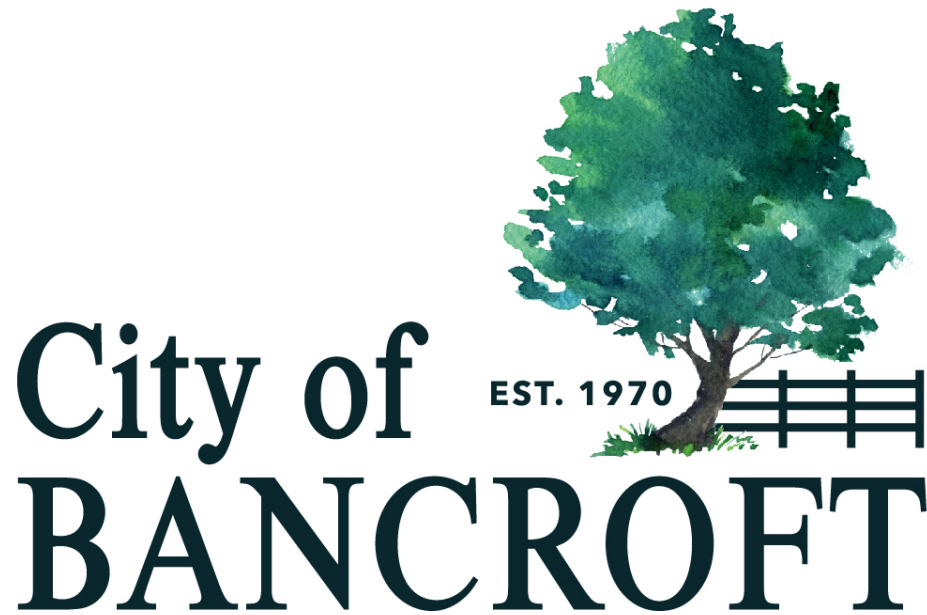

MAYOR'S NOTES

As most of you should know by now, at our June commission meeting the annual tax and budget ordinances were passed. As usual we do our best to contain the rate of your property tax, knowing we have no say in the PVA valuation. Once again we were able to approve a tax rate of .286, a slight reduction over last year. I think it is important to understand that as slight as that might be, it is neither an increase nor remaining the same as the prior year.

I am writing this after the July 4th bicycle parade in the city. I was able to walk it with my daughter and her family and all the friends in the neighborhood. I think all the children enjoyed decorating their bikes,

too.

Bancroft has a nuisance ordinance that prohibits frequent and persistent barking dogs in the city. Your dog may be deemed a nuisance if it is allowed to continuously bark.

INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX FEES

We are asking for your help to ensure that your insurance company is aware that you reside in the **City of Bancroft**, not the City of Louisville. This allows Bancroft to receive the tax fee instead of Louisville.

POLICE NOTES FROM CHIEF MUDD

I've noticed a couple of garage doors left up well after midnight during some of my recent late night patrols. I understand that it was probably just an oversight, but this could easily give thieves access to the interior of your home. Even with a locked interior door leading into the home, most of us probably have many tools in our garages that would make it possible to get through them quickly. Please remember to close your garage door when settling in for the night and reduce the chances that you will become a crime victim.

Also, I wanted to put out some information for some of the newest residents of

HOW CAN WE CONTACT THE POLICE?

For immediate police assistance:

1. Emergency: **Dial 911**
2. Non-emergency police assistance: **Dial 311**

For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:

1. Call our police line at **(502) 263-3663**. Leave a voicemail with your name and phone number. Chief Mudd will call you back when he is on duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Mudd is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Mudd to get assistance for an emergency.
