REPOSTED REMINDERS.

Parking and Public Nuisance ordinances (Chapters 72, 91 and 92). Some of these are also required by Louisville Metro ordinance as well. 1- Manner of Parking: Vehicles must be parked with their right-hand side toward and parallel with the curb. This is more about safety than anything else as a

vehicle parked facing traffic must generally pull across the oncoming lane in

order to proceed, elevating the possibility of an accident.

2- Limitations of Stopping and Parking,: No person shall stop or park a vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control device, within thirty (30) feet upon the approach to any stop sign located at the side of the roadway. 3- Parking in Excess of Certain Number of Hours Prohibited: It shall be unlawful for anyone to park in any one place any vehicle on any of the public ways or streets of the city for a period of 24 hours or longer. 4- Parking on Private Property: Any vehicle parked on private property must be

on a driveway made of blacktop or concrete. Parking in the grass is not

5- Placement of Temporary Containers: No person, without prior written permission from the City Commission, shall cause any temporary container, including but not limited to dumpsters, Bagsters, POD's, any temporary facility (such as temporary offices or restrooms), or shipping containers, to be placed, parked, or stationed on any street, alley, sidewalk, or other public way within
