## **NOTES FROM CHIEF MUDD**

Happy New Year to all Bancroft residents! I hope it has started well for all of

you. Over the last month, I'm sure many of you have noticed an increased effort at radar enforcement on Greenlawn Road. This has been in response to both complaints from Bancroft residents as well as those who live adjacent. Over the previous six weeks, I have written approximately 10 state citations for speeding, the highest speed observed being 45 miles per hour. There have been numerous verbal warnings issued for lower speeds (35 - 40 miles per hour). I have watched some of the violators pass pedestrians as they sped into our city.

I want to remind everyone that the speed limit on Greenlawn is 25 miles per hour. Please remember to slow down even more when there is inclement weather, at night, or if you are passing pedestrians. I'd also like to remind pedestrians to wear reflective clothing or do something to make themselves (and even their pets) stand out while walking through the city, especially on Greenlawn. We are seeing a tremendous increase in volume due to construction and schools.

### **INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX FEES**

We are asking for your help to ensure that your insurance company is aware that you reside in the ***City of Bancroft***, not the City of Louisville. This allows Bancroft to receive the tax fee instead of Louisville.

2. Non-emergency police assistance: **Dial 311**

### **For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:**

1. Call our police line at **(502) 263-3663**. Leave a voicemail with your name

and phone number. Chief Mudd will call you back when he is on duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Mudd is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Mudd to get assistance for an emergency.
