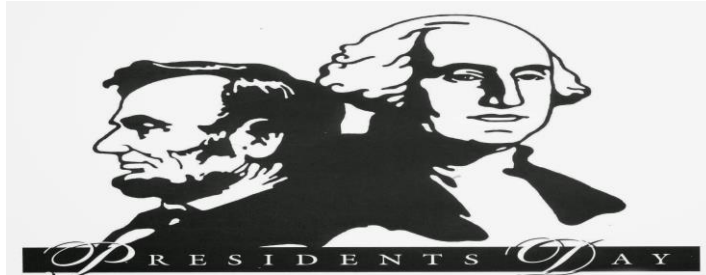

DOES YOUR MAILBOX NEED ATTENTION?

Please note the following tips from the United States Postal Service.

Mailboxes take a beating from the weather, so we recommend an annual mailbox checkup to avoid damage to your mail or difficulty identifying your address.

- Tighten loose hinges on the door
- Take care of rusty or loose parts
- Replace missing or faded house numbers
- Keep the path to your mailbox clear

WET WEATHER! Just a reminder that if you have a sewer grate in front of your house, please keep it clear. Failure to do this can potentially cause big problems when it rains, flooding your neighbors downhill and possibly the roads. Also make sure your gutters are functioning properly and free of debris.

Insurance Premium Tax Fees

We are asking for your help to ensure that your insurance company is aware that you reside in the **City of Bancroft**, not the City of Louisville. This allows Bancroft to receive the tax fee instead of Louisville

FRIENDLY REMINDER Bancroft City Ordinance 50.16 requires residents to remove empty

garbage/recycle/yard waste cans from street-side by midnight on the day of pick up. If Rumpke fails to pick up your garbage/recycle/yard waste, first call Rumpke (568-3800) to request pick up, then call or email the City Commissioner for Public Services. (Contact information to the right).

SAFETY TIPS AND REMINDERS FROM CHIEF YEAGER

Please make sure your house number is clearly visible from the street. Always keep your garage doors closed and your car doors locked and ensure that bicycles, mowers, ladders, etc. are kept secured. Don't give thieves the temptation. **Please if you need police assistance dial 911!** If Chief Yeager is on duty he will be dispatched and if not, Louisville Metro will be contacted. If you are planning a trip. Please email Chief Yeager with your address, emergency contact information, dates you are away and if anyone will be at your home. Chief Yeager will then keep a record of this so if there is an emergency he can contact you.

Snowy Streets

The arrival of cold weather could bring more snow or ice. The City of Bancroft has a contract to salt when icy and remove snow when we get 3 inches or more at one time.

When it snows, please do not park on streets to aid snow removal.

RUMPKE

Recycling collection days for February and March are Mondays 2/4, 2/18, 3/4 and 3/18. Yard debris will be picked every Monday as well. Rumpke will no longer pick up yard debris left in plastic bags. Questions, contact Rumpke at 568-3800.
