BRING ON SPRING !!!

Spring is a great time to get out and walk or jog. If you are out during dusk or dawn hours, be sure to wear reflective clothing. It is a very serious safety issue as it is very difficult to see you and drivers are often distracted. Also, drivers please watch out for walkers and joggers as well as children at play.

APRIL SHOWERS... BRINGS MAY FLOWERS!

Wet weather reminders. If you have a sewer grate in front of your house, please keep it clear. Failure to do this can potentially cause big problems when it rains, flooding your neighbors downhill and possibly the roads. Also make sure your gutters are functioning properly and free of debris.

FRIENDLY REMINDER Bancroft City Ordinance 50.16 requires residents to remove empty garbage/recycle/yard waste cans from street-side by midnight on the day of pick up. If Rumpke fails to pick up your garbage/recycle/yard waste, first call Rumpke (568-3800) to request pick up, then call or email the City Commissioner for Public Services.

HOW CAN WE CONTACT THE POLICE ?

1. Emergency-Dial 911
2. Non-Emergency-Dial 311
3. NEW: Talk to Chief Yeager via the Bancroft Police Car Phone. For non-dispatch communication, you can call 502-263-3663 and leave a voicemail message with your name and phone number and Chief Yeager will call you back when he is working. For your safety please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Yeager is working, then they will dispatch him to help you. If Chief Yeager is not working, then they will dispatch a Metro Police Officer to help you.

CAN YOU HELP?

Yes, you can, and we need your help in preventing crime.

Don't make it easy for thieves by leaving cars unlocked. Don't leave valuables in cars. This just makes stealing easy for thieves. Leaving garage doors open is an invitation for intruders. Bancroft has very little crime, but that doesn't mean we are immune from crime. Chief Yeager works hard to keep Bancroft safe, but he needs residents to assist by taking a few simple crime prevention steps.

- Turn on your porch lights and exterior lights at night.
- Keep your doors locked, even in the daytime.
- Lock your car doors and remove valuables from your cars, even if locked.
- Keep your garage door closed, especially at night.
- If you see something suspicious, then say something.
- Call 911 if you see a prowler.
- Call Chief Yeager if you would like more information on effective crime prevention techniques.
